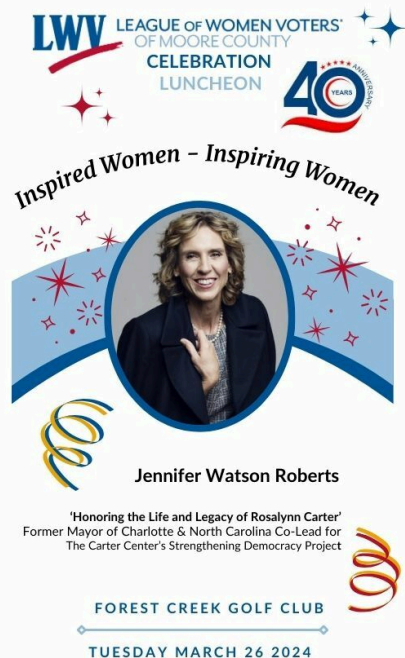

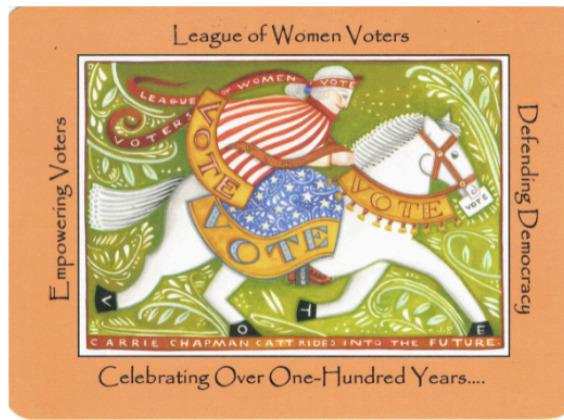

Weiss will discuss NASA's preparation to send the Artemis II crew further than ever before into space aiming to establish a permanent base of operations at the Moon's South Pole. This foundational outpost on the shores of a vast cosmic sea will allow humans eventually to follow the trailblazing robotic missions that explore the Solar System and beyond, some of which look back nearly to the beginning of the Universe itself.

The film will be introduced by its co-executive producer, Eric Christenson of Southern Pines. It will also be followed by Major (retired) Jason Criss Howk who will discuss the enduring impact of the life of George C. Marshall and the growing need for more leaders like him in our increasingly chaotic world.

General Marshall was a resident in Pinehurst for 15 years. His remarkable accomplishments - Chief of Staff of the US Army throughout WW II, then Secretary of State and Secretary of Defense, and recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize – are memorialized by plaques in Pinehurst's Marshall Park.

At the Central Carolina's Women's Assembly on March 16th, the League provided a Voting Booth for children to vote for their favorite female superhero, in honor of Women's History Month.

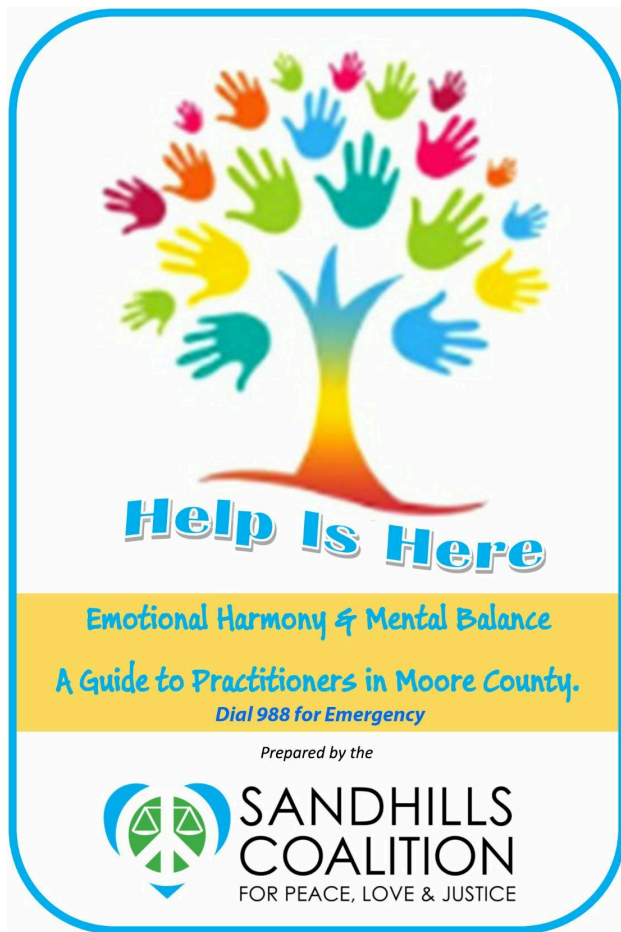
Disney's Ariel won, but several moms got write-in votes!

Area Mental Health Provider Directory Is Now Available

The Sandhills Coalition for Peace, Love, & Justice, has published a new directory of mental healthcare providers in the area. Entitled "Emotional Harmony and Mental Balance: A Guide to Practitioners in Moore County," the directory is intended as a quick reference guide, to help people locate mental healthcare when they need it. The Coalition is currently distributing this resource guide to the public and is seeking the community's help in the distribution effort.

The directory contains lists of local psychiatrists, psychologists, substance abuse centers, residential facilities, and support groups that deal with the full range of mental healthcare needs. It also provides contact information --- phone numbers and websites --- for mental health counselors who might be needed in emergencies.

The Coalition was able to publish this directory after receiving a \$2,000.00 micro-grant provided by The Carter Center and Root Change, as well as contributions from local individuals.
