Sponsored by the League of Women Voters of Moore County Guidelines and Application Process

A \$1000 College Scholarship

This Scholarship is established to encourage active participation of youth in the American political process and in service to their community, both now and in the future.

Eligibility: Moore County public high school seniors, with at least a “B” average. Although the scholarship winner will be announced in January of the senior year, the “B” average must be maintained through high school graduation.

Application Process/Datelines:

August 26-30, 2019 – Scholarship Applications delivered to high schools

October 15, 2019- Application, resume, recommendations, and essay due to guidance counselor – a school transcript will be attached.

October 16,17,18, 2019 - A representative from the LWV will pick up completed scholarship applications, and transcripts from each high school.

October 28 -December 15, 2019 – Applications reviewed by the LWV Scholarship Committee

January 6 –10, 2020– Scholarship Finalists invited to personal interview with LWV Scholarship Committee

February 4,2020 – Winner(s) announced following Board meeting

March17, 2020 – Scholarship officially presented at Lunch with Legends, Pinehurst Country Club

May, 2020– Scholarship check sent to student
